Why use The Scorecard:

This is an evaluation tool to assist you in casting your vote for an elected representative or candidate. To help you determine if they stand up in safeguarding your family, our country's future and as a result deserve your vote and support. It indicates verifiable public commitments and voting records that either support or undermine our hard won way of life.

How the Score is determined:

In each province, we identify 4 key areas of measurement that impact on our rights and freedom as citizens:

- 1.) Public statement of commitment (Politician's Pledge),
- 2.) Voting history on critical legislation,
- 3.) Verifiable public statements,
- 4.) Responses to periodic questionnaires on important issues.

"Safe Supply" Narcotics Program Act


